

# A Trip Down Memory Lane



#### Evelyn Handforth's Memories from VE Day

Friday 8<sup>th</sup> May took Evelyn Handforth back to her days as a Land Girl. Rochdale Masonic Hall celebrated VE Day in style, with a three course meal, brass band and footage of VE Day. Many had dressed for the occasion in uniforms and evelyn loved it.

Evelyn recalls receiving six weeks training in Staffordshire at a big house, learning about farming, how to milk cows and drive tractors. This was Evelyns daily routine. Evelyn was only eighteen years old when she was called to serve her country. I asked Evelyn if she was ever wounded in the War, Evelyn replied laughing only by the cows that kicked me!

Evelyn missed her family greatly and would cry herself to sleep most nights. She missed her mum terribly and would be in bed by 8:80pm every night. Evelyn dearly wanted to return home and eventually she AWOL from the land army and later left due to a bad back from bending down all the time. Evelyn was so relieved when she finally left the army and when VE Day came she was glad it was all over. Evelyn said she would love to relive her youth as she feels she missed out due to being in the army.

The land army wasn't recognized for what they did in WW2 for many years but Evelyn now feels that this is it. Evelyn has kept a medal in her jewelry box for many years that she is very proud of. Evelyn finished off with saying she had a lovely time at Rochdale Masonic Hall it brought back many memories and some of the songs made her feel very emotional. Evelyn danced the night away and had a ball.

# A Trip Down Memory Lane



#### Ernest Norbury's Memories of VE Day

Ernest Norbury is a 95 year old gentleman who served in the second World War for 6 years. Ernest joined when he was twenty years old; he wanted to join the Navy but due to his height, him being 5ft 11in the Irish Guards it turned out to be.

Celebrating VE Day brought a lot of memories back for Ernest. Ernest remembered the last time he was in the trenches and landing in Normandy when it was announced the war had ended. Ernest stayed another twelve months in Normandy after the war had finished. Whilst Ernest was serving his country himself and a fellow soldier were blown up and ended up in hospital. Although Ernest had concussion and eye problems from the effects of the explosion he was sent straight back to continue with his service. His fellow soldier had had his leg blown off. Ernest was wounded twice whilst serving for his country and he lost many friends in the war.

When Ernest was 25 he was made Acting Company Sargent Major and was in charge of eighty soldiers. Ernest felt this was a lot of responsibility put on him for his age. He was also a Pipe Major and was in a band. At the back end of the War Ernest finished up doing doctoring for soldiers. If it wasn't for men like Ernest we wouldn't have the life we have today.

Ernest enjoyed his evening out celebrating VE Day, he did however state that some of the uniforms weren't right.
