In Flanders fields.



During the Second World War Roland "Ron" Crook joined the Army. In 1942 he enlisted in the Royal Signals and after basic army training he began a course at the school of signals Catterick Garrison on the art of becoming a wireless operator. Three months later, and completely happy, he became a class one wireless operator. In 1943 Ron volunteered for service with SOE Special Operations Executive. The training included a parachute course and a course overseas on codes and ciphers. He was dropped by parachute to join partisans in Yugoslavia who he assisted by organizing airdrops of arms and ammunitions.

Later Ron came home and in May 1945 he was sent to Norway.
